## STATEWIDE SUBSTITUTE TEACHER SHORTAGE

We are currently experiencing the impact of a severe statewide substitute teacher shortage in our classrooms here at Dilworth School. If your schedule allows for flexibility, and you have a four-year college degree in any subject area, including fields outside of education, you could qualify to be a substitute teacher by passing one basic skills test and obtaining a certification.

The flexibility of serving as a substitute teacher allows you to work as many (or as few) days as you would like. You are also able to choose to be available only for our school or for any school in the District. As a substitute teacher, you would be positively impacting our students (your children!) and getting paid to do so.

**RELIGIOUS HOLIDAY ABSENSE** - Regular attendance plays an important role in student achievement. The District will work with parents/guardians and students to ensure their compliance with all state laws, and may use appropriate legal means to correct problems of chronic truancy. Student absence for religious instruction or participation in religious exercises may be considered excused. In order to receive an excused absence for participation in a religious exercise or holiday, advance written request by the parent/guardian must be submitted to the school site. On October 29th, Dr. Helen Sung will explain why emotional intelligence is needed to support the successful implementation of the Common Core State Standards recently adopted by the state of California. What are the influencing forces of cultural beliefs and emotions in the learning process? What can you do to support your child's success as we transition to Common Core?

**EVERY DAY COUNTS!** - Our goal this year is to ensure that every student attends school regularly. *Showing up for school has a huge impact on a student's academic success starting in kindergarten and continuing through high school. Even as children grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students get to school safely every day and understand why attendance is so important for success in school and in life.*

We realize some absences are unavoidable due to health problems or other circumstances. But, we also know that when students miss too much school— regardless of the reason – it can cause them to fall behind academically. Your child is less likely to succeed if he or she is absent often.

#### **Research shows:**

- Children who are absent often in kindergarten and 1<sup>st</sup> grade are much less likely to read at grade level by the end of 3<sup>rd</sup> grade.
- By 6<sup>th</sup> grade, high absenteeism is a proven early warning sign for students at risk for dropping out of school.
- By 9<sup>th</sup> grade good attendance can predict graduation rates even better than 8<sup>th</sup> grade test scores.
